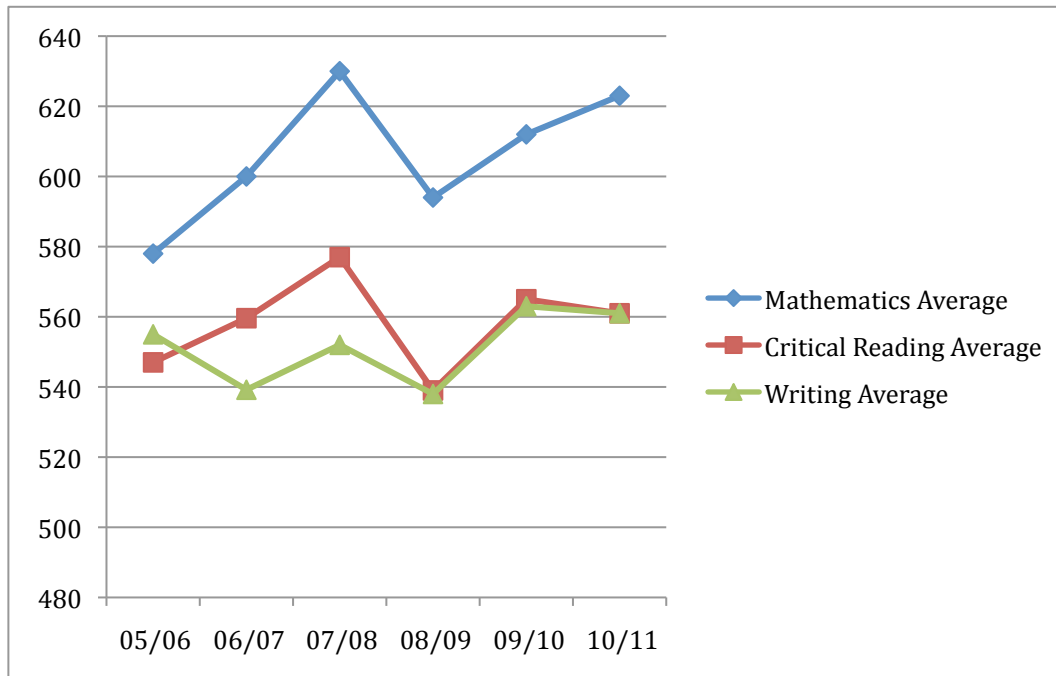


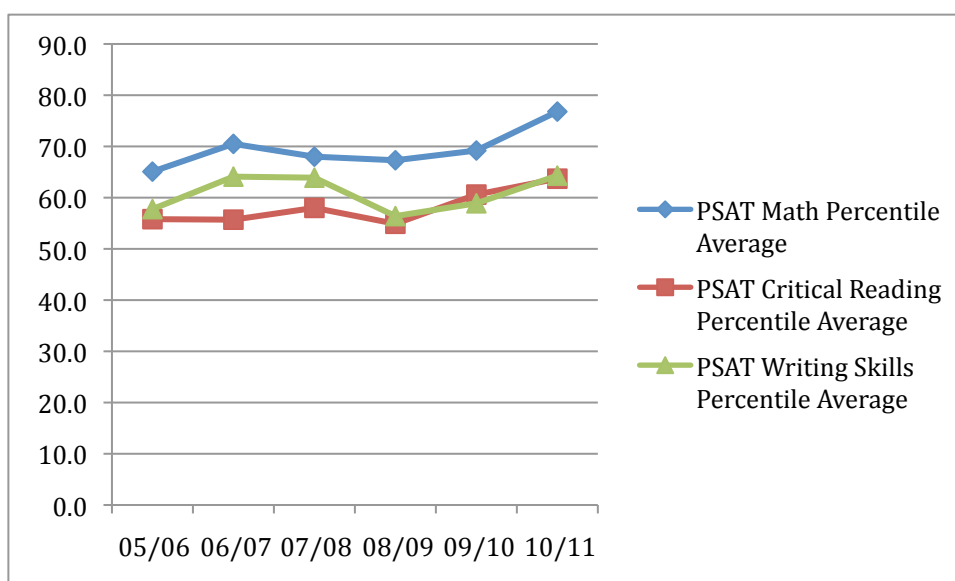
CAJ SAT Data (seniors)

Over the past 6 years, math averages have been higher than critical reading averages and writing averages. In 05/06, the SAT added the writing component.



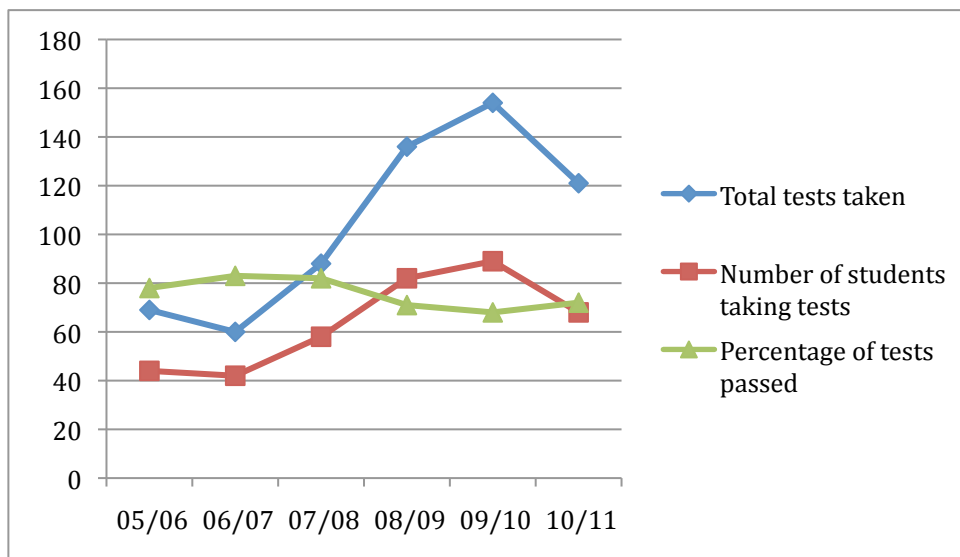
CAJ PSAT Data (grade 11)

Over the past 6 years, math averages have been higher than critical reading averages and writing averages.

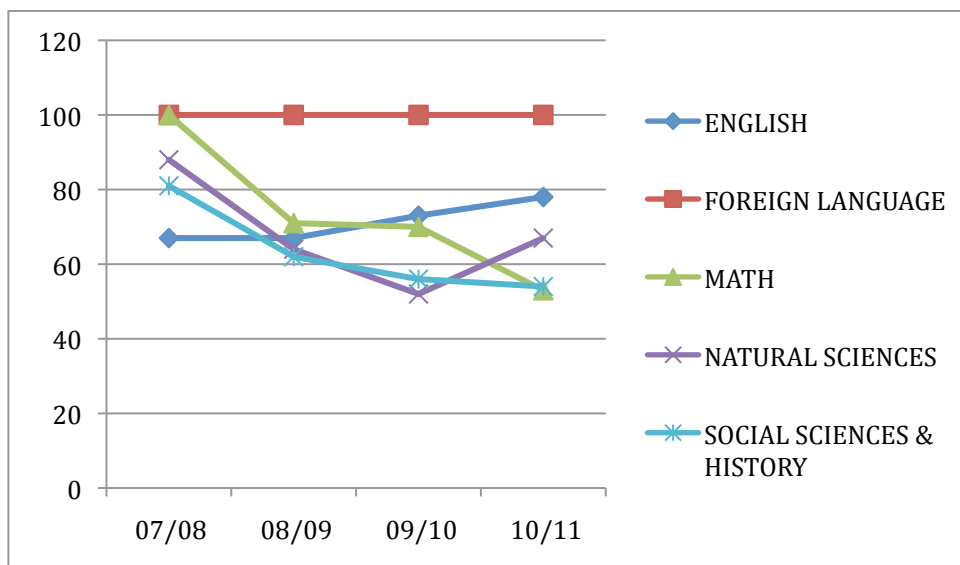


CAJ Advanced Placement (AP) Data (grades 10-12)

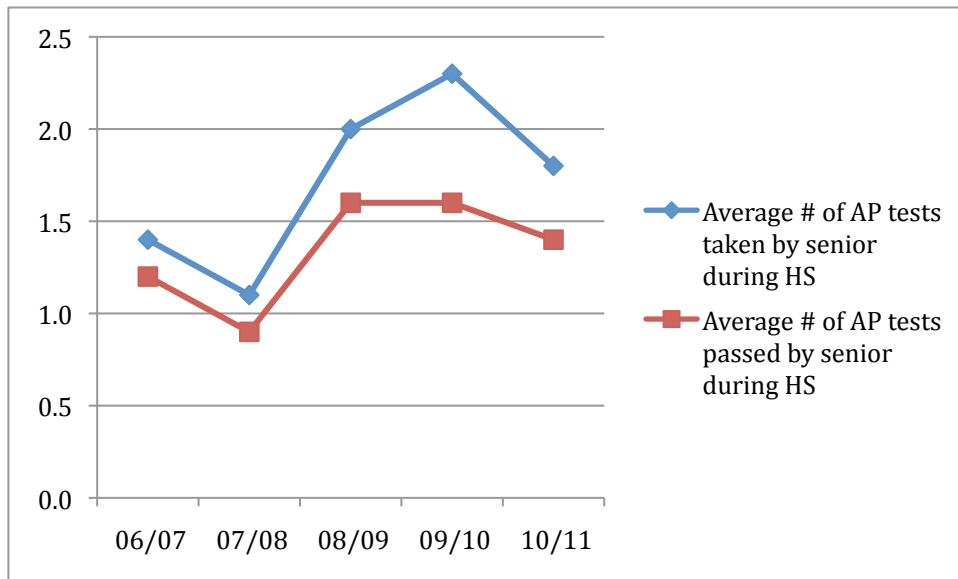
Since 05/06, the number of tests taken and the number of students taking tests have increased. The pass rate has ranged from 68% to 83%. When the total number of tests taken increases, the number of tests passed always increases, while the percentage of tests passed tends to decrease.



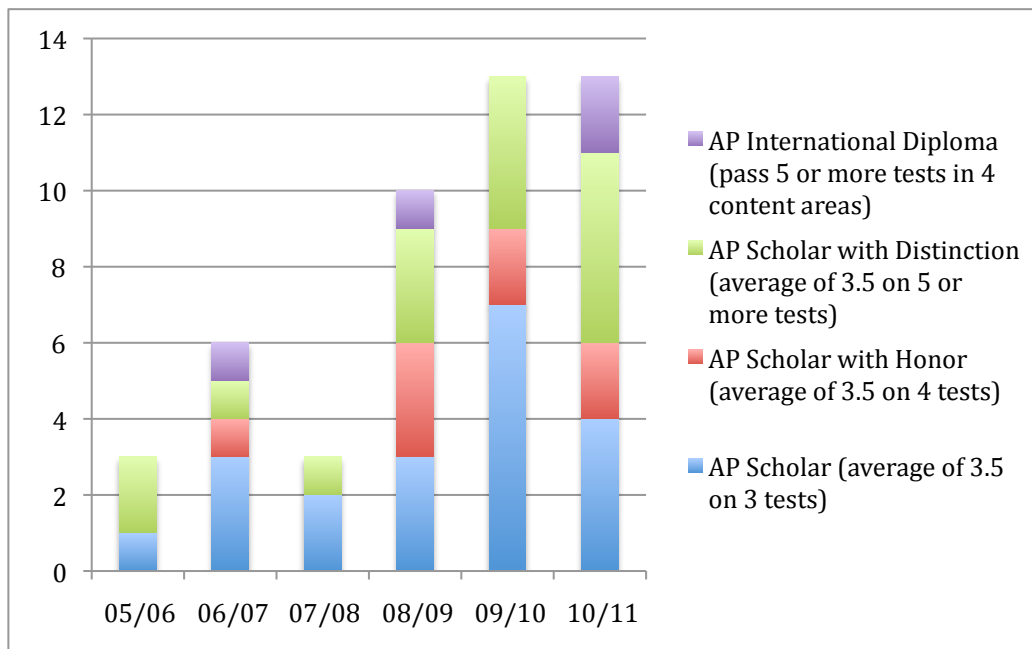
Over the past 4 years, foreign language (Japanese) pass rates have been consistent. English pass rates have gradually increased. Math pass rates have decreased, and social sciences/history pass rates have decreased.



Since 06/07, the average number of AP tests taken by graduating seniors and the average number of AP tests passed by graduating seniors have increased. (In 06/07 AP Psychology was not offered, and in 07/08 AP Biology was not offered.)



Over the past 6 years, the number of advanced placement awards earned by graduating seniors has increased.



CAJ Iowa Test of Basic Skills Data (average years above grade level)

Over the past 6 years, our overall averages in all test areas are consistently above grade level. The amount of “above grade level” average varies in different test areas: math and language skills have been higher than those of science, reading, social studies and vocabulary. Vocabulary has consistently been the lowest. Starting in 08/09 a new test given to students in grades 2 - 9. Previously the test was given to students in grade 2 - 8 and 10.
